The Contemporary Violin Makers Exhibition hosted by Reed Yeboah Fine Violins will for the first time include a blind-listening test: *Just Listen!* The exhibition gives players a chance to try instruments by over fifty contemporary violin makers, and *Just Listen* provides a rare opportunity to remove all distractions and focus exclusively on sound. A selection of twelve violins will be blind-tested by top level players for a small audience. Players will wear darkened goggles and stand behind an acoustically transparent screen. Short musical excerpts, some with piano accompaniment, will highlight the instruments' various playing-qualities. Players and listeners will vote on their favorite instruments. The violins will then be returned to the exhibition, and available for sale.
